You perhaps remember the KIMP/KImageShop discussion that recently took place on this mailinglist. I'm happy to announce that Michael Koch (KImage), and myself (Matthias Elter, KHelpCenter) have started an image manipulation application called KImageShop.

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. . .

And so KImageShop got started, for real!

And the plans were ambitious, already: * Based on KOM (dcop avant-la-lettre) * XML-based file format * RGB * CMYK * Compatible with Gimp plugins * Scriptable with Python * Based on an ImageMagick core * Multi-threading * 16/bit channel images

We're *still* not there!



Development took off!

Carsten Pfeiffer, Matthias Elter, Michael Koch...

But by October 1999, development had all but stopped.

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So, we fast-forward to August 2000:

But the next version has * CMYK, RGB, GRAY, XYZ, Watercolors * 8, 16 or 32 bits/channel * openEXR support * Even more color management * Scripting * A full dcop interface * Channel separations * Adjustment with curves * More filters
